

EHMS 'A Virtual Night at the Museum'

Middle level students have unique needs and capabilities and are truly caught in the middle between childhood and adulthood. Students at Ecker Hill hold the key to much of what they know and are able to do. They understand their strengths and can identify the things that are difficult for them. Too often they are the last people consulted in evaluating their own learning.

On March 24th, we are holding 'A Night at the Museum' as a way to provide all of our students an opportunity to showcase their work and allow them to discuss their learning. This evening is focused on students and their growth. There are three main purposes for this evening:

1. Show evidence of student learning;
2. Provide opportunity for students to reflect on their learning;
3. Foster and promote responsible, respectful, and productive relationships among school, family and community.

We are excited to "see" you all online on March 24th. 'A Night at the Museum' begins at 4:30 pm and concludes promptly at 8:00 pm. Families will need to sign-up for a 10-minute virtual meeting with their child's remote learning teacher through the Online Scheduler. Remote learner group 1 will be assigned to Ms. Gina Mason and group 2 will be assigned to Ms. Deb Dekoff. *Please note, if your child returns to in-person learning for quarter 4, we will still assign them to Ms. Mason or Ms. DeKoff for this event.* The link to sign-up will be posted on the EHMS website and emailed to parents on Tuesday, March 16th.

During your time with your child's remote learning teacher you can expect to listen to your child share their 1-2 learning experiences and/or projects with you that highlight their learning and growth this year, especially in light of challenges we faced due to the pandemic. The teacher will facilitate this reflective conversation and help your student identify celebrations and future goals.
